

Terms and conditions of participation in the 'Sevenet Story Scene' conference organised by Sevenet S.A.

1. These Regulations set out the general rules for participation in the Sevenet Story Scene Conference on the 21.05.2026r.
2. Before placing an order for participation in the Conference, please read the following Terms and Conditions carefully. By starting to use the service, the Participant confirms that they have read the content of the Terms and Conditions, understand and accept its content, and undertake to comply with it.
3. To place an order, the Participant orders the participation service by providing their details: first and last name, email address, telephone number, company name, and position. The Participant is required to familiarize themselves with the Terms and Conditions and confirm their acceptance by making the statement "I accept the Terms and Conditions of participation."
4. The service of participation in the Conference is free of charge.
5. The Participant may submit a complaint related to the provision of the service by the Organizer. The complaint can be submitted electronically. The person submitting the complaint should provide their details, including contact information and a description of the reason for the complaint. Complaints that do not meet these requirements will not be considered. The Organizer will consider the complaint no later than 14 days from its submission and will respond to the email address provided in the complaint notice.
6. The Terms and Conditions are available free of charge on the website: <https://storyscene.sevenet.pl/> in a form that allows its acquisition, reproduction, and storage in any form. The Participant may save the Terms and Conditions on any medium.
7. The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the Terms and Conditions. The Organizer will announce the changes on the website at least 7 days before they take effect. The change to the Terms and Conditions becomes effective 7 days after publication. The Participant is informed about each change to the Terms and Conditions by sending information to the email address no later than 7 days before the day the change takes effect. If within 7 days from the day the email message referred to in the preceding sentence is delivered, the person does not inform the Organizer about the non-acceptance of the change to the Terms and Conditions, they are bound by the Terms and Conditions in their new wording.
8. The Terms and Conditions and contractual relations between the Participant and the Organizer are subject to Polish law and are concluded in Polish.
9. The Terms and Conditions come into force on 17.02.2026.

Organisation and course of the conference

1. The organiser of the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the 'Conference') is Sevenet S.A., ul. Juliana Tuwima 25, 80-210 Gdańsk (hereinafter referred to as the 'Organiser').

2. The deadline for submitting an application for participation in the Conference via the Conference Website Conference Internet Service shall expire on the date specified by the Organiser.
3. The Organizer is not liable for the provision of incorrect or false data by the Participant during the registration of participation in the Conference.
4. The Conference takes place on 21.05.2026r. in the premises of "Mudo Sopot", Aleja Franciszka Mamuszki 2, 81-718 Sopot.
5. The organiser reserves the right to make sound and image recordings (recording) and to take photographs taking photographs during the conference.
6. The purpose of audio and video recording and taking photographs is to document the course of the conference and to use the recordings or photographs for training, promotional and Organiser's advertising purposes, including placing them on websites or on the profiles of the social networking profiles maintained on Facebook, LinkedIn or YouTube, among others.

Rules of participation in the conference

1. Participants are required to:
 - a) use their real name, surname and the name of the represented entity;
 - b) refrain from any action disrupting the work of other participants or aimed at destroying resources;
 - c) not to publish content that is prohibited by law, including content that violates personal rights, copyrights or related rights;
 - d) not to impersonate other participants.
2. The Organiser has the right to withdraw a participant's access to the meeting in the event of breach of the provisions referred to in point 1.
3. Regardless of the rules described in point 1, participants undertake to comply with other guidelines provided by the Organizer in connection with the organization of the conference.

Processing of personal data

1. As part of the conference, the processing of personal data of participants may include:
 - a) basic and contact data: name, surname, telephone number, e-mail, name of the organization which the participant represents;
 - b) data contained in recordings of the conference (image);
 - c) data contained in photographs (image);
2. The organiser is the administrator of the participant's personal data with regard to:
 - a) basic and contact data - this data is processed in order to organise the conference on the basis of the so-called legitimate interest referred to in Art. 6 para.1(f) of the RODO, consisting of maintaining ongoing business contacts, business and etc;
 - b) data stored in the form of recordings on the provider's infrastructure - this data is processed for the purpose of documenting the conference proceedings and their possible use them for promotional and advertising purposes, on the basis of the so-called legitimate interest referred to in Article 3 (1)(b).

legitimate interest referred to in Article 6 (1)(f) of the RODO, consisting of promoting its own activities;

c) data stored in the form of photographs - this data is processed in order to documenting the course of the conference and their possible use for promotional and advertising purposes, on the basis of the so-called legitimate interest referred to in referred to in Article 6(1)(f) of the RODO, consisting in the promotion of its own activities.

3. The Organiser may pass on Participants' personal data to its subcontractors and partners/sponsors of the event. In such a case, the service provider that received the Participant's personal data becomes the data controller. The entities referred to above may be provided with the Participant's personal data: name, position, company, email address.
4. The processing of data by the Organiser will continue until the legally legitimate interest constituting the basis for the given processing activity ceases, however, not longer than for a period of 2 years.
5. In the case of recording of the conference and taking photographs and the expression of appropriate consent, the participants' images may be published on the Organiser's websites and profiles on and on the Organiser's profiles on social media. In this case the legal basis for the processing of personal data will be the consent of the participant (art. 6 section 1 lit. a RODO), and the processing will last until the participant revokes the given consent.
6. In cases defined by law, the participant has the right to access personal data, rectification, erasure or restriction of processing, the right to object to the processing and the right to data portability. To the extent that processing is based on consent, the participant has the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing which was carried out before its withdrawal.
7. If the processing of personal data is considered to be in breach of the law, participant has the right to lodge a complaint to the supervisory authority, i.e. the President of the Office of the Office for the Protection of Personal Data.
8. In the case of collecting data directly from participants of the meetings, providing personal data is voluntary. Provision of basic and contact data may be necessary to participate in the conferences, which will not be open.
